- *Rinse and flatten milk jugs and cartons*
- *No Styrofoam*
- *No plastic wrap or plastic bags*

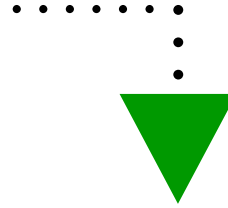
Monday to Friday 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.

-Newspapers and flyers, magazines, catalogues, calendars - bundled or bagged
-White and colored office paper—separated
-Box board (cereal, laundry soap, cards, etc.)
-#1 plastic (pop, water, liquor bottles)
-#2 plastic (vinegar, milk jugs, ice cream pails, shampoo, javex, etc.)
-#4, #5, #7 plastics (ketchup, mustard, sour cream)
Tin/steel cans - Rinse, especially pet foods
Milk cartons and juice cartons
Tetra paks - juice boxes and aluminum lining
Glass food/beverage containers/liquor glass
Corrugated cardboard—bundle, box or bag—Drop off at depot ONLY.

Recycling bins are situated in the Town of Lac du Bonnet across from the Town Office on Second Street.

RESPONSIBLE ELECTRONICS RECYCLING

E-waste is extremely toxic when not disposed of in an approved manner. The RER program was first conceived four years ago when it was noted that electronics waste or e-waste often found its way into landfills throughout Manitoba. Although there are several recycling programs available to Manitobans currently none specifically addresses electronics waste. The RER program operates in conjunction with the Selkirk & District Community Learning Centre. The Centre has the facilities to act as an e-waste recycling depot for the Municipality as well as a pivot point for e-waste education in the region. Staff and volunteers at the Centre ensure e-waste is disposed of in a responsible manner.

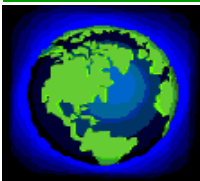
